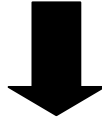


The Water Flushing Project Continues:

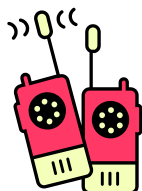

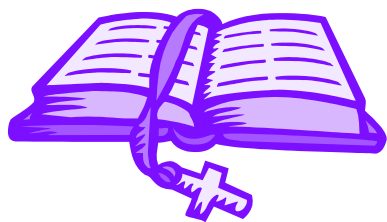
