BURN BAN



Burn restrictions are in effect in Pacific County for forest and yard debris until further notice. Recreational campfires are allowed if built in improved fire pits in designated campgrounds, such as those typically found in local, county, and state parks and in commercial campgrounds. On private land, campfires are permitted with the landowner's permission if built in the following manner:

- In a metal, stone or masonry-lined fire pit, such as those seen in approved campgrounds.
- Not exceeding three feet in diameter.
- Have an area at least 10 feet around the campfire cleared of all flammable material and have at least 30 feet of clearance from overhead fuels (such as tree limbs).
- Attended at all times by a responsible person at least 16 years old with the ability and tools to extinguish the fire, such as a shovel and either five gallons of water or a connected and charged water hose.

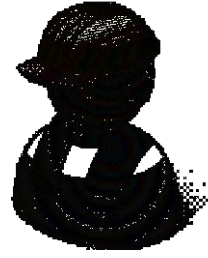
Always completely extinguish campfires by pouring water or moist soil in them and stirring with a shovel until all parts are cool to the touch. The use of self-contained camp stoves is encouraged as an alternative. The use of burn barrels is prohibited by law in Washington.

Did you know that your water & Field dept. has replaced over 3,000 feet of pipe since the first of the year?

Our next project will be the replacement of 1,200 feet of 8" pipe between the following addresses 30515 G St. to 30911 G St.

We plan on starting this fairly large project shortly after Rod Run or the latter part of September. It is our hope that we will have had some rain by then as the super dry sand makes it very hard to work in and to restore the worksites back to a usable firm state. Once the rain starts we will be spreading grass seed to help reduce the blowing sand from the project areas.

The above mentioned project will probably take us about 2 weeks to complete. During this time there will be intermittent detours between 313th and 303rd and water outages on G Street within the work zone.

G St. in this area may at times be just one lane and things will look pretty messed up in front of the homes in this area.

We want to remind all drivers utilizing G Street that the **SPEED LIMIT** is **25 MPH** and slower in the work zones. We would appreciate that you drive accordingly and **WATCH OUT FOR US.**

I should also mention here that **TRAFFIC FINES DOUBLE** in work zones.

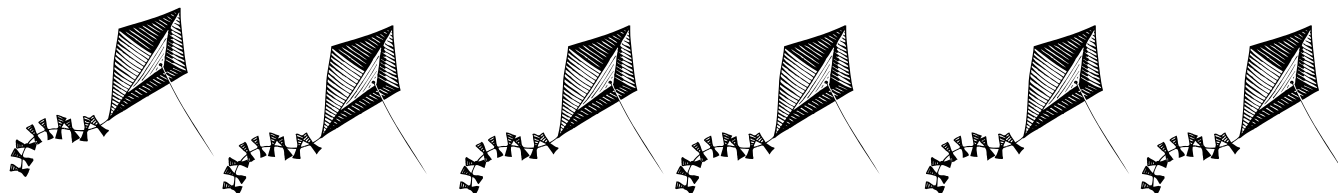

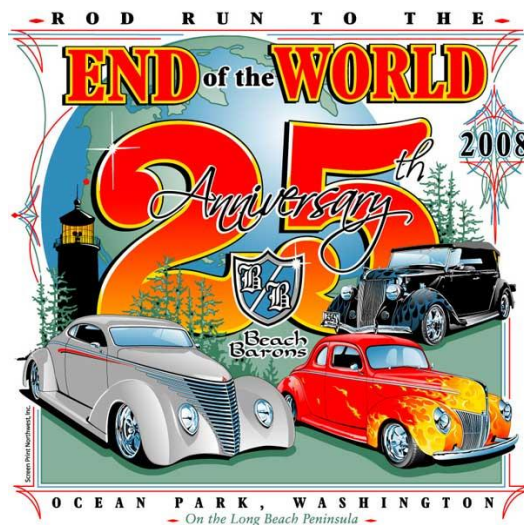
