October 10-11, 2009 at the Bolstad Avenue beach approach in Long Beach.

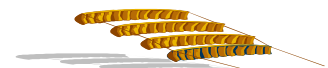
One Sky one World, International Kite Fly for Peace is held the second Sunday of October annually, around the globe.

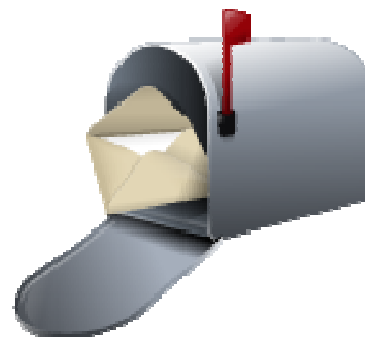
