## RAZOR CLAM SEASON TENTATIVELY SET

The first razor-clam dig of the fall season will get under way Oct. 16 if marine toxin tests show the clams are safe to eat. The Washington Department of Fish and Wild (WDFW) announced recently.

Evening digs are tentatively scheduled for:

Friday, Saturday and Sunday October 16, 17 and 18th.

Wednesday, November 4, Friday November 6 and Saturday November 7th.

Wednesday, December 2, Friday, De-

cember 4 and Saturday, December 5th.

Thursday, December 31st, Friday, January 1st and Saturday, January 2, 2010.

The results of the 2009 summer stock assessment show that Long Beach, Twin Harbors and Kalaloch Beach have had an increase in their allowable catch.

The best time to start digging is an hour or two before low tide, said Ayers who also recommends that diggers check weather and surf conditions

before heading out. Harvesters are reminded that the limit is fifteen clams and that you must keep the first 15 you dig. **Also remember that all digs start after 12 noon. Check your tide table for best starting times.**

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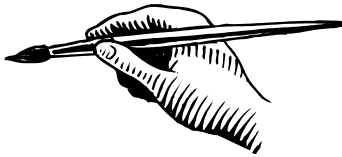
## PENINSULA ART ASSOCIATION
