The 2010 Surfside billing statements will be mailed on December 18, 2009. Included in the statement will be the payment option form. (see sample below). This form must be completed and returned to the Surfside Business Office by February 16, 2009 if you wish to make payments on your annual dues. This payment plan gives you the opportunity to spread your payment over a six month period. There is a one percent service charge on the unpaid balance after sixty days and every thirty days thereafter until the account is paid in full. Also please note that if you choose to use a credit card to pay your dues there will be a 3 percent service charge applied.

H1N1 CLINICS FOR THE GENERAL PUBLIC

South Bend, Washington-The Pacific County Health Department will begin holding H1N1 clinics for the general public on Monday, December 14th. **Clinics will be by appointment only.** The clinics are for anyone six months or older interested in being vaccinated. The vaccine will be available in both the shot and the nasal mist.

The Health Department will begin taking appointments on Monday, December 7th, Please call between the hours of 9 am—12 pm and 1 pm—4:30 pm.

COLD WEATHER AND FREEZING WATER PIPES

How to keep your pipes from freezing in the winter. There are not too many steps to this one but it is sure to keep your pipes from freezing. If you know it is going to be cold enough to freeze just simply turn each fixture on just a little. Only on the cold side. Just a small stream will keep water circulating and will ensure that it doesn't freeze. Check each fixture and make sure they are all just trickling out. This will not cost you very much to do and you only have to do this on the nights you know it's below freezing. **REMEMBER ONLY DO THE COLD SIDE!** There is no reason to do the hot side plus this will cost you more money. Cold water will not cost you very much at all. In the morning when you get up you can turn them back off since when you are at home you usually use enough water to keep it circulating. If you are going to be gone and no one will be home it is probably a good idea to leave water running just a bit. **Check the Surfside web page for more information on cold weather tips.**
