PROTECTING OUR CANALS AND LAKES

ATTENTION HOMEOWNERS, ESPECIALLY THOSE ALONG THE LAKES AND CANALS

It is very important to limit the amount of fertilizer and pesticides used on the land area adjacent to the waterways. Remember, any chemical product used on the land, ends up in the water due to run off. Also when cutting, removing or trimming vegetation (including just grass) along the water, make sure to remove it so it does not end up being blown into the canals or lakes and adding to our algae problem.

Do not throw grass clippings or other vegetation cuttings in the canal or lakes. Please dispose of them properly. We are in the process of treating the algae growth now and this will keep it from becoming a bigger problem. Thanks for you cooperation.”

Efforts that homeowners along the canal and lakes can do on their own is to rake out weeds, these can either be dried out and burned or taken to the transfer station at 67th and Sandridge for disposal.






AUQA TECHNEX COMPLETES TREATMENT OF CANAL!

The invasive species control was completed earlier this week. The remaining floating plant that is covering a great deal of the canal at this time is Mosquitofern. This species grows rapidly during the summer months and should diminish this winter. Densities vary from year to year and this year's infestation has been extreme. As cold weather approaches the canal should be clear of this growth.

In the next few weeks we will be looking at specific treatment for this infestation to prevent a reoccurrence !
