
PROTECT DRINKING WATER FAUCET ATTACHMENTS AND SPRAY NOZZLES

Common activities associated with water use can cause a hazard to your public drinking water. Events such as power outages and main breaks can create low pressure in the water system and can siphon water from private property back into the public water system.

Kitchen spray nozzles, faucet attachments, and hand held shower heads can become a hazardous connection to contaminated water when they become submerged.



Spray nozzles and faucet attachments are often located at kitchen sinks, utility sinks, bathtubs, showers, shampooing sinks, and pet washing tubs. Newer fixtures and

built-in fixtures are often designed so that they will not reach a submersible level or they retract so they will not stay submerged. However many older or after-market fixtures can become submerged.



Please remember that a spray nozzle and faucet attachment is a direct connection to your drinking water. Never leave spray nozzles and faucet attachments laying in anything you wouldn't want to drink!
