ASBESTOS CEMENT PIPE TRAINING



Four water crew members will be attending the Asbestos Cement Pipe Work Practice Procedures class given by Washington Environmental Training Center (WETRC) on April 11th and July 31st. This will be a refresher course for Gil and Chris who are both trained in AC pipe handling.

This will be Justin's and Charles' initial AC pipe handling training.

This course presents approved training in compliance with the most recent Department of Labor and Industries regulations. Participants learn safe and field-proven procedures to protect themselves from cancer-causing asbestos fibers, how to avoid costly penalties, how to recognize asbestos health hazards, how to prevent exposure to deadly asbestos fibers, and how to choose and use protective equipment.
