

## NOTICE OF CONSERVATION RATE

On February 17<sup>th</sup>, 2018 at the Regular Meeting, the Board of Trustees passed Resolution 2018-02-03, ADOPTING AND AUTHORIZING A CONSERVATION POLICY FOR WATER USE THAT IS EXCESSIVELY DISPROPORTIONATE AND WASTEFUL.

Individually metered single family residential connections, individually metered multifamily units, and undeveloped properties exceeding 10,000 cubic feet in one metering period (monthly meter reading cycle) will be considered excessively disproportionate and wasteful.

Shared (master metered), multifamily residential connections (condominium, duplex, townhouse, etc.) whose water use exceeds an average of 7,500 cubic feet per residential unit in one metering period (monthly meter reading cycle), will be considered excessively disproportionate and wasteful.

Beginning April 1<sup>st</sup>, 2018, a Conservation Charge (Fine) of \$0.03 for each cubic foot exceeding the above stated limits will be assessed against members as a fine for water use that is considered excessively disproportionate and wasteful.

The resolution also authorizes enforcement action for nonpayment of fines and/or failure to repair water leaks.
