TOXIC PLANTS

1

Research on plants and flowers that are poisonous to dogs. Remove toxic house plants immediately.



PEOPLE FOOD

2

Don't share your snacks with your dog! Giving him food from "the table" and random snacks can do more harm than good.



HOUSEHOLD CHEMICALS

3

Keep cleaning agents, insecticides, and other harmful household products out of reach.



MEDICATION

4

Consult your vet before giving medicine or supplements to your dog.



SURROUNDINGS

5

Watch out for toads, bees, ants, and snakes. Also, keep dogs away from contaminated water and unknown plants.

FLEAS AND TICKS

1

If your dog keeps scratching, chewing, and losing hair, apply treatment immediately.



ANNUAL SCREENING

2

Take your dog to the vet for screening once a year. Get him tested for harmful things, and other internal parasites.



PROPER GROOMING

3

Never skip on regular baths and use vet-prescribed grooming products to keep away bugs and fleas.



UPDATE VACCINE SHOTS

4

Boost your dog's immune system by making sure his shots are up to date.



BE VIGILANT OUTDOORS

5

Keep your dog away from contaminated soil, rats and prey, feces and vomit, and other infected animals.



DOG SAFETY TIPS DURING SUMMER

PROTECT YOUR DOG FROM THE HEAT AND OTHER SUMMER HAZARDS

LIMIT OUTDOOR TIME

1

Bring water and stay beneath shady spots to minimize sun exposure.



RUNNING ERRANDS

2

Never leave your dog alone inside the car, especially during summer.



WATER ACTIVITIES

3

Watch out for hazards like jellyfish or undertow. Stay close to your dog while in the water.



PARASITES

4

Ask your vet for preventive treatment against fleas, mosquitoes, or ticks and other parasites.



SUMMER EVENTS

5

Summer festivals expose your dog to loud noises, toxic food, and crowds. Your pet would be much safer and more comfortable at home.

Have you lost your keys or phone , sunglasses or reading glasses?

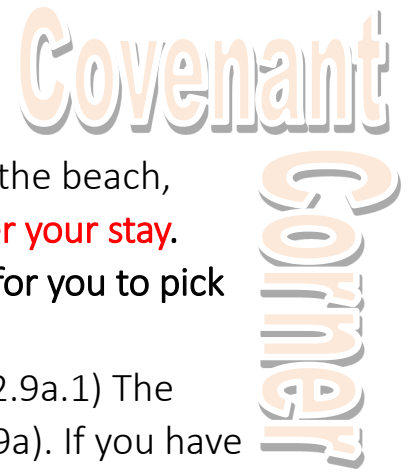
Lost items are often brought into the office, we then label the item and place it in our Lost & Found box.

Summer RV Season Started March 15th



It's here! The summer RV season is upon us and that means sun, fun, and permits. If you plan to bring your RV back to your home at the beach, **please stop by the office and get a conditional use permit and register your stay.**

Permits will not be sent via email, but we can arrange to leave them for you to pick up after hours.

The summer use permit is good from March 15th to October 31st (2.9a.1) The **permit must be prominently displayed and visible from the street** (2.9a). If you have no windows facing the street we can laminate the permits for \$1 or supply you with a



plastic sleeve so you can tape the permit to a street-facing side of your rig.

In addition to being a covenant, permits are a safety measure ensuring only owners and their guests are parked on a lot and not squatters. And remember, **all RVs must be registered, licensed, and maintained in a mobile condition at all times** (2.9a). Happy glamping!

Life Safety Project

You can order these address signs from the Pacific County Fire District 1 for only \$20.00, and they will come out and install it for you if you request them to do so.


These address signs help assist EMS when trying to locate your home during an emergency. There has many an instant that the EMS services could not locate the address.

In our Restrictive Covenants, Section 5.13 reads "It shall be the duty of each owner to ensure that the correct street address is posted in an appropriate manner on the property, for public health and safety purposes."

If you don't already have an address at your property this is a quick and easy solution.

Emergency Lock Boxes through Pacific County Fire District #1

In an emergency, every second counts, and valuable time can be lost if your home is locked, and you are unable to answer the door. In an effort to solve the problem, Pacific County Fire District #1 offers a Lock Box Program. They allow first responders to enter your home in an emergency when people inside your home are unable to open the door or are not present.

Pacific County Fire District No. 1 provides lock boxes which are high security key safes and assists with their installation as a public service to the residents of the community. There is a \$55.00 donation for the lockbox. Residents furnish their own keys to be placed in the box.

Division III• 9-12 years

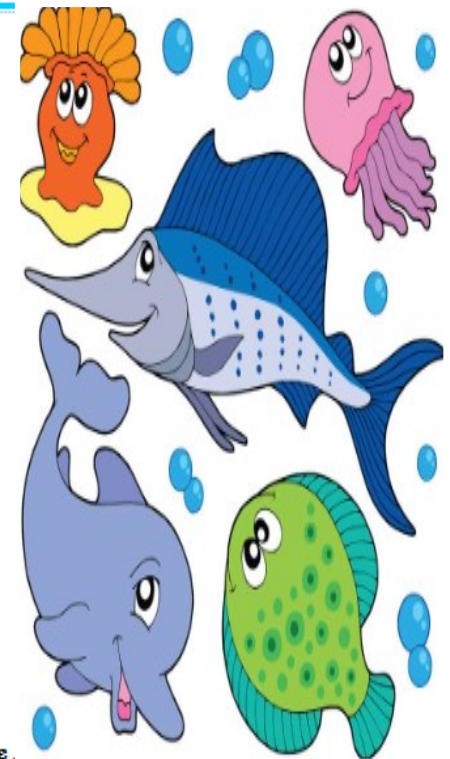
- Hot dogs, chips, cookies, and drinks will be provided from 11 am until 1 pm by the Surfside Office.

FISHING RULES:

- We want to make sure that the kids have a great experience! To help make this happen and to ensure the safety of all, please obey the following Surfside Fishing Derby Rules:
- No activities that might result in somebody's injury, including running on bridges, rough-housing, etc.
- Help others who may not know how to fish.
- Obey the requests from Surfside Bridge Officials. They are there to help ensure your safety.
- The use of corn is strictly prohibited - it kills the fish.
- All fish must be caught during the Derby hours of 8:30-11:30. Return any carp to the canal.
- Adults are encouraged to help their child fish, but the child must be present at all times.
- No adult fishing until the Derby is over.
- For questions during the Derby, ask an official at the bridge or the Surfside Office. They're here to help you even if you've been in the derby or fished before.

REMINDER...

ALL building plans must be submitted to the Architectural Committee prior to any construction.

Pacific County will not approve permitting until the committee has signed off on all plans.

The committee meets every Tuesdays at 9 a.m. at the business office. The building packets are on our website at surfsideonline.org/forms/ or you can pick them up from the business office. Applications must be received by end of day on Thursdays to make the agenda for the following Tuesday's meeting.

Please notify the business office if you want to attend the meeting in person.

If you are building on a vacant lot without an address, please post a sign so the committee knows which lot will be developed.

Two (2) sets of plans must be submitted to the committee. Once approved, you will get a copy of the approved plan. Take it to the county for their approval as needed. Surfside will retain one set of approved plans to keep on file.
