- No fishing license required! \*Limit of 8 fish per child do not clean the fish before measure-in.
- Measure fish any time between 9:00am until12:00 pm from the Surfside Office. Remember to be in the
  registration line by 12:00 pm to qualify for division prizes. Don't forget to turn in your registration card
  even if no fish are caught! You may still win a prize during the raffle.
- There will be three (3) winners in each division (age group) for the longest fish. Ties will be broken by weight. Limit of one award per registrant.

- We want to make sure that the kids have a great experience! To help make this happen and to ensure the safety of all, please obey the following Surfside Fishing Derby Rules:
- No activities that might result in somebody's injury, including running on bridges, rough-housing, etc.
- Help others who may not know how to fish.
- · Obey the requests from Surfside Bridge Officials. They are there to help ensure your safety.
- The use of corn is strictly prohibited it kills the fish.
- All fish must be caught during the Derby hours of 8:30-11:30. Return any carp to the canal.
- Adults are encouraged to help their child fish, but the child must be present at all times.
- No adult fishing until the Derby is over.
- For questions during the Derby, ask an official at the bridge or the Surfside Office. They're here to help you even if you've been in the derby or fished before.

There will be another opportunity to meet the candidates on Monday, May 29th during the Pancake Breakfast where there will be no formal Question-and-Answer session. Candidates & Members are encouraged to mingle.

The final formal Q&A Meeting will be held Saturday, June 10th at 10am at the Surfside Office. This Q&A Meeting will not follow a Board Meeting and it will be moderated.

#### **Election Committee Update**

**Surfside Trustee Elections** 

Once each year Surfside HOA holds elections for trustees who represent the membership on the board of trustees. The board is made up of a total of nine trustee positions. Per the By-laws, trustees serve three-year terms. Each year members vote for 3 trustees with three-year terms. If there are any vacant or open positions these positions are also required to stand for elections at the next annual meeting, for the remaining years of the vacated position. For the July 2023 trustee elections, there are 5 trustee positions members will vote on.

At each annual election of trustees, members will be instructed to vote for all open positions as designated on the election ballot. Members will cast one vote for each of the open positions. The three candidates with the highest vote counts will be assigned to the three-year terms. The fourth highest vote count will receive the next

longest partial term, and so on.

Members can only vote if all dues or assessments are paid in full. Membership in the HOA is dependent upon owing a lot in the HOA. If a member owns more than one lot, they are still allowed only one vote. If the membership is owned by more than one person or entity, only one person may vote on an election ballot or submit a proxy vote.

The election packets are sent to members in early June and are to be returned to the to the address listed on the return envelope or business office no later than Thursday, July 6th, by 3pm. Members may also vote in person at the annual meeting on ballots distributed at the annual meeting.

# Note to the Membership from the Election Committee

There will not be electronic voting for this years Annual Meeting. The Election Committee will be looking into electronic voting for next year.

# Genealogy Seminar by Sandra Melvin Wednesday, May 31, 2023 at 2 pm in the HOA Boardroom

Sandra Melvin has lived the majority of her life on the Columbia River and the Long Beach Peninsula, but for 18 year in the oil fields of Southeast Texas as a professional genealogical researcher searching for the rightful owners of mineral rights for various oil companies. She has served as president of the Clatsop County Genealogical Society, president of the Long Beach Genealogical Society, Chair of the Texas Tyler County Historical Society, President of the Woodville Texas Rotary Club, Board Member and VP of the Tyler County Heritage Museum in Woodville Texas. Sandi has 45 years' experience tracing family lineages. She also spearheaded the Lewis & Clark Corps of Discovery Descendant Project from 1998 through 2004 culminating in a book containing 1654 documented descendants (both direct and collateral) of the 33 member expedition. A special celebratory reunion of descendants was held in the area (Astoria, Seaview, Long Beach, & Fort Stevens) in 2004. This required the solicitation and cooperation of countless volunteers, organizations, and government officials, including the local Indian tribes.

# **Compactor Recycling**

To help with the confusion on recycling, the chart shows the number on the plastic item that is used to sort out recyclables.

The recyclable "triangle" on the bottom of the container has a number in it. If the number is 1, & 2, it can be recycled and disposed of properly. If it is any other number, it must be put in with your garbage and thrown into the compactor.

We hope this helps to clarify and speed up your time at the compactor.

#### YES, RECYCLE:



HDPE
Polyethylene (high density)

These codes can be found on soda bottles, water bottles, cleaning products, milk and juice jugs, shampoo bottles, some retail bags.

## NO, THROW AWAY:



These codes can be found on plastic wraps, cooking oil containers, PVC containers, vinyl and styrofoam products.

### MAYBE:



Since few recycling centers process these plastics, call the center and ask if they accept these plastics.


# Life Safety Project

#### Emergency Lock Boxes through Pacific County Fire District #1

In an emergency, every second counts, and valuable time can be lost if your home is locked, and you are unable to answer the door. In an effort to solve the problem, Pacific County Fire District #1 offers a Lock Box Program. They allow first responders to enter your home in an emergency when people inside your home are unable to open the door or are not present.

Pacific County Fire District No. 1 provides lock boxes which are high security key safes and assists with their installation as a public service to the residents of the community. There is a \$55.00 donation for the lockbox. Residents furnish their own keys to be placed in the box.

Surfside Emergency Management Committee participates in Washington State and Pacific County Emergency Communications Exercise.

On April 29th Surfside's Emergency Management Committee participated in a Pacific County and Washington State Emergency Communication Exercise. Participating in the event were Amateur Radio Operators Allen Gifford KI7TMQ and David Mullins K4ARP manning the Surfside Communication Center K7SRF. During this exercise, Allen and David demonstrated Surfside's emergency amateur radio station equipment and radio operators' skills to send Voice, Packet Digital Data, and Winlink Radio Email messages to/from local and state officials. No internet or cell phones were used.

Committee members routinely participate in these exercises.

On Saturday, April 29, Pacific County RACES/ARES participated in two statewide exercises (one with the State EOC, one with WSDOT) designed to test our ability to communicate following a disaster. The exercises themselves went very well. As our EC/RO Bob Cline stated "one of the best ever".



The Emergency Management Committee is looking for volunteers. The purpose of the

EMC is to identify potential emergency management issues facing Surfside; assess their potential seriousness, frequency and likelihood; identify means for protecting Surfside lives and property from loss or damage; develop recommendations for Surfside members to protect their health and safety; identify measures Surfside can take to protect lives and property in the event of emergencies; work cooperatively with federal, state, and local emergency management agencies and resources; assess the effectiveness of emergency management at all levels; and make improvements.

Plan on installing a fence, a shed, a gazebo or building a garage or a house?

RFMINDFR...

ALL building plans must be submitted to the Architectural Committee <u>prior</u> to any construction.

Pacific County will not approve permitting until the committee has signed off on all plans.

The committee meets every Tuesdays at 9 a.m. at the business office. The building packets are on our website at <u>surfsideonline.org/forms/</u> or you can pick them up from the business office. Applications must be received by end of day on Thursdays to make the agenda for the following Tuesday's meeting.

Please notify the business office if you want to attend the meeting in person.

If you are building on a vacant lot without an address, please post a sign so the committee knows which lot will be developed.

Two (2) sets of plans must be submitted to the committee. Once approved, you will get a copy of the approved plan. Take it to the county for their approval as needed. Surfside will retain one set of approved plans to keep on file.
