

Drivers: Share the Road

- People on bicycles have the same rights and responsibilities as people behind the wheel of a vehicle.
- Yield to bicyclists as you would motorists and do not underestimate their speed. This will help avoid turning in front of a bicyclist traveling on the road or sidewalk, often at an intersection or driveway.
- In parking lots, at stop signs, when packing up, or when parking, search your surroundings for other vehicles, including bicycles.
- Drivers turning right on red should look to the right and behind to avoid hitting a bicyclist approaching from the right rear. Stop completely and look left-right-left and behind before turning right on red.
- Obey the speed limit, reduce speed for road conditions and drive defensively to avoid a crash with a cyclist.
- Give cyclists room. Do not pass too closely. Pass bicyclists as you would any other vehicle—when it's safe to move over into an adjacent lane.

DRIVERS SHARE THE ROAD

For drivers, sharing the road begins with the understanding that bicyclists and motorcyclists have the same rights as you. They also face unique safety challenges, such as being smaller and less visible. Look for cyclists where vehicles do not appear, like before making a left-hand turn at an intersection. Also, be aware that motorcyclists may have to downshift and weave to avoid bumps and road hazards.

Pedestrians have rights on the road, too. Always slow down and be prepared to yield to pedestrians when they're in a crosswalk. Never pass vehicles stopped at a crosswalk, as there may be people crossing whom you can't see. And, be extra cautious when backing up across sidewalks or in parking lots.

PREVENT A DEADLY CRASH

As more Americans choose to ride bikes and walk to stay healthy, and as an alternative to driving, pedestrian and cyclist deaths in motor-vehicle-related crashes have increased over the past decade.

Bicyclists: There were 966 bicyclists killed in collisions with vehicles in 2021.

Pedestrians: In 2021, 7,388 pedestrians died in traffic crashes, up from 6,565 in 2020.

Motorcyclists: The number of people killed on motorcycles in 2021 was 5,932.

Join us in helping to keep everyone safe on the road. Remember, no one – no driver, cyclist, or pedestrian – has sole rights to the road. It's a shared space where we all have rights and responsibilities.

North Head Lighthouse Tours


May 10 @ 11:00 am - September 30 @ 3:00 pm—\$3

North Head Lighthouse has opened for tours for the 2023 season. Tours are available every 15 minutes from 11 am to 3 pm (the last tour starts at 3 pm) They will run daily through September 30th.

Tickets are \$3 per adult, Children 7-17 are free in the company of an adult (children under the age of 7 are too young to climb the tower)

The newly restored lighthouse is among Southern Washington's most photographed sights, and the light room on top offers spectacular views out to sea and of surrounding beaches and forests.

A Discover Pass (\$30 a year/ \$10 a day) is required to park in the lot at the lighthouse.



Plan on installing a fence, a shed, a gazebo or building a garage or a house? REMINDER...

ALL building plans must be submitted to the Architectural Committee <u>prior</u> to any construction.

Pacific County will not approve permitting until the committee has signed off on all plans.

The committee meets every Tuesdays at 9 a.m. at the business office. The building packets are on our website at <u>surfsideonline.org/forms/</u> or you can pick them up from the business office. Applications must be received by end of day on Thursdays to make the agenda for the following Tuesday's meeting.

Please notify the business office if you want to attend the meeting in person.

If you are building on a vacant lot without an address, please post a sign so the committee knows which lot will be developed.

Two (2) sets of plans must be submitted to the committee. Once approved, you will get a copy of the approved plan. Take it to the county for their approval as needed. Surfside will retain one set of approved plans to keep on file.
