Surfside Healthy Waterways

Land, Buildings, and Waterways Committee

During the summer months, the waterways are at increased risk of developing algae blooms which can be toxic to humans, pets, and wildlife. While Surfside HOA has treated Seabreeze Lake for blue green algae in spring 2023, we need to remain vigilant for signs of algae proliferation.

As homeowners, we play a big role in wetland protection and health. Protecting a wetland doesn't necessarily require additional effort; often times it is what we don't do that is most important.

Dumping or allowing yard debris into the waterways is detrimental to a safe and healthy aquatic environment. While yard waste is made up of natural materials that will eventually decompose, they can damage a wetland in the process. As they decompose, it causes oxygen depletion, and provides nutrients for the proliferation of blue-green algae. This results in a rotten egg smell and massive algae blooms during the summer.

Fertilizers also represent a potential threat to water sources by providing nutrients that allow blue green algae to thrive. Avoid using fertilizers adjacent to lakes, canals, and streams. Do not add more than the maximum amount posted by the manufacturer, which helps prevent the excess from running into the waterways, as well as saving the homeowner money.

To ensure a fair and transparent election process, the Surfside Board has employed an independent individual known as the Designated Election Committee Chairperson (DECC) along with assistants. They will meticulously tabulate all member votes.

Member Motions at the Annual Meeting

If you want to make a motion at the Annual Meeting, please prepare the motion ahead of time. We will have a “Motions Desk” that you can submit your motion to. Motions will be typed up and displayed on the screen for the members to see. Please include your printed first and last name and your Surfside owned property.

Motions regarding covenants would be for the board to review. If the board pursues the change to the covenants, a special hearing would be scheduled so that the entirety of the membership is aware of the proposed change. The Board of Trustees would then vote on that change at the next regular board meeting.

COVENANT CORNER

Summer is here and that means everyone is outside working on their property. If you are considering clearing your lot, or cutting down trees you'll need to check in with Pacific County on land clearing permits or tree cutting permits. If contracting a business to do the work, please make sure they have secured the proper permits to prevent any fines from Pacific County.

In section 2.5 of the Surfside Restrictive Covenants, **Outdoor burning of land clearing debris or construction debris is prohibited.** Small (3-foot x 3 foot) campfires, cooking fires, and natural yard debris fires are permitted provided they meet the criteria for such uses adopted by the Pacific County Fire District #1, and meet the requirements of Section 5.8.

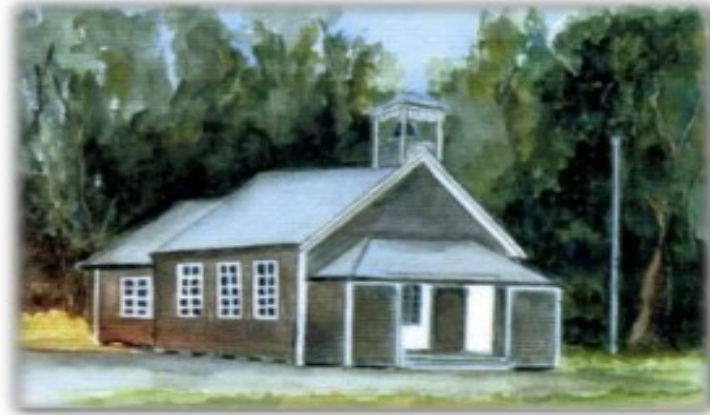
In section 5.8, Owners shall use their platted parcels in such a manner so as not to interfere with the health, safety, and comfort of other property owners. Intrusive lighting, noise, including loud, amplified music, boisterous parties, **and smoke from fires that unreasonably interferes with others' enjoyment of life and property are not permitted.**

As always, never leave an unattended fire burning.

Surfside has a chipping site available to all members in good standing, where you can take your limbs from tree trimming. The chipping site is located at 350th & G St., and is open Wednesdays and Saturdays from 10 am—2 pm. See page 6 for details on the chipping site.

North Head Lighthouse has opened for tours for the 2023 season. Tours are available every 15 minutes from 11 am to 3 pm (the last tour starts at 3 pm) They will run daily through September 30th.

Tickets are \$3 per adult, Children 7-17 are free in the company of an adult (children under the age of 7 are too young to climb the tower)

The newly restored lighthouse is among Southern Washington's most photographed sights, and the light room on top offers spectacular views out to sea and of surrounding beaches and forests.

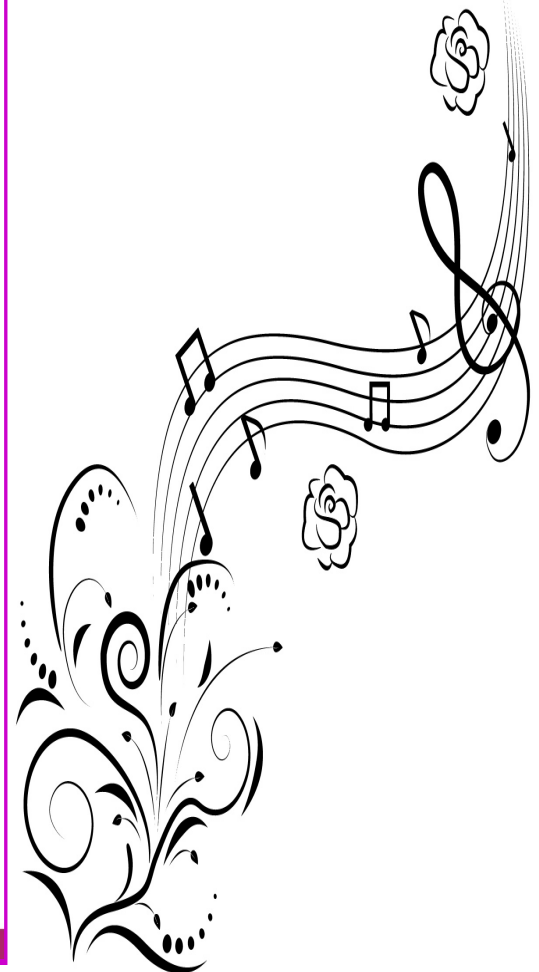

Plan on installing a fence, a shed, a gazebo or building a garage or a house?

REMINDER...

ALL building plans must be submitted to the Architectural Committee prior to any construction.

Pacific County will not approve permitting until the committee has signed off on all plans.

The committee meets every Tuesdays at 9 a.m. at the business office. The building packets are on our website at surfsideonline.org/forms/ or you can pick them up from the business office. Applications must be received by end of day on Thursdays to make the agenda for the following Tuesday's meeting.

Please notify the business office if you want to attend the meeting in person.

If you are building on a vacant lot without an address, please post a sign so the committee knows which lot will be developed.

Two (2) sets of plans must be submitted to the committee. Once approved, you will get a copy of the approved plan. Take it to the county for their approval as needed. Surfside will retain one set of approved plans to keep on file.
