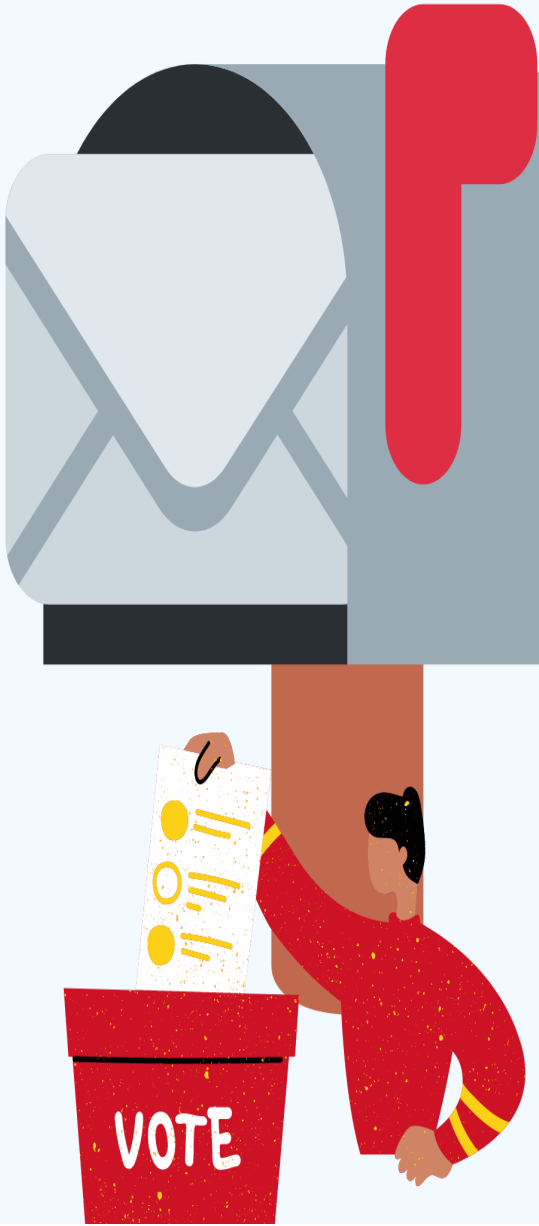

### DOG SAFETY TIPS DURING SUMMER

PROTECT YOUR DOG FROM THE HEAT AND OTHER SUMMER HAZARDS

- LIMIT OUTDOOR TIME**  
Bring water and stay beneath shady spots to minimize sun exposure.
- RUNNING ERRANDS**  
Never leave your dog alone inside the car, especially during summer.
- WATER ACTIVITIES**  
Watch out for hazards like jellyfish or undertow. Stay close to your dog while in the water.
- PARASITES**  
Ask your vet for preventive treatment against fleas, mosquitoes, or ticks and other parasites.
- SUMMER EVENTS**  
Summer festivals expose your dog to loud noises, toxic food, and crowds. Your pet would be much safer and more comfortable at home.

### PROTECT YOUR DOG FROM PARASITES

SHIELD YOUR PET FROM THESE SMALL BUT TERRIBLE CREATURES

- FLEAS AND TICKS**  
If your dog keeps scratching, chewing, and losing hair, apply treatment immediately.
- ANNUAL SCREENING**  
Take your dog to the vet for screening once a year. Get him tested for harmful things, and other internal parasites.
- PROPER GROOMING**  
Never skip on regular baths and use vet-prescribed grooming products to keep away bugs and fleas.
- UPDATE VACCINE SHOTS**  
Boost your dog's immune system by making sure his shots are up to date.
- BE VIGILANT OUTDOORS**  
Keep your dog away from contaminated soil, rats and prey, feces and vomit, and other infected animals.

# HOT PAWS

Prevent burnt paw pads during summer months: **avoid hot surfaces**

Asphalt, metal, concrete and rocky surfaces can get very hot on a summer day: 10-30 degrees warmer than the ambient air.



- Walk in a grassy area
- Take walks during cooler mornings or evenings
- Buy protective dog boots; styles are available in a variety of sizes and price points
- Signs the ground is burning your pet's paws: repeated lifting of each paw. Test the surface by pressing your hand to the ground for 5 seconds; if it's too hot for you it's too hot for your pet's paws.
- If you suspect your pet has heat-injured paws, visit your vet immediately

Many people use fertilizers, weed killers and pesticides to enhance their yards and gardens.

But if you use too much of these products or apply them at the wrong time, runoff can easily carry them from your lawn or garden into storm drains and ditches. From there they can end up in lakes, streams, Puget Sound and other marine waters.

Weed killers and pesticides are designed to kill plants and animals. However, when they get into our waters, they can kill plants and animals that are not a problem. Fish and amphibians are vulnerable to these chemicals.

Like in the garden, fertilizer in lakes and streams makes plants grow. But too much algae and other aquatic plant growth can make boating, fishing and swimming unpleasant. What's more, as the algae and other plants decay, they use up the oxygen in the water that fish and other aquatic life need.

**Lawn and garden care doesn't have to be a problem.  
What will you do to help?**

- ◆ Read the label. Follow the instructions.
- ◆ Use fertilizer sparingly. Many plants don't need as much as you might think. Too much can even harm them. Also, roots, leaves and fruits need different nutrients. Test your soil to find the right dose and type to match the your plants' needs.
- ◆ Don't treat your lawn or garden right before a rainstorm.
- ◆ Use slow-release fertilizers and other more environmentally friendly products.
- ◆ Try non-chemical alternatives. Use compost. Plant companion plants that deter pests. Pull weeds by hand. Use mulch. Trade lawn for native groundcover or shrubs.
- ◆ Get expert advice about lawn and garden products from Master Gardeners at your county WSU Extension office.

**We all need clean water.**

We drink it, fish in it, play in it. We enjoy all it adds to our lives. In fact, we need it to survive. Fish and wildlife do, too.

More than 60 percent of water pollution comes from things like cars leaking oil, fertilizers and pesticides from farms and gardens, failing septic tanks, pet waste, and fuel spills from recreational boaters.

All these small, dispersed sources add up to a big pollution problem. But each of us can do small things to help clean up our waters too—and that adds up to a pollution solution!

Using fertilizers and pesticides sparingly also helps you:

- ◆ Save money.
- ◆ Make yards safer places to play.
- ◆ Support a healthy watershed.

REMINDER...

ALL building plans must be submitted to the Architectural Committee prior to any construction.

*Pacific County will not approve permitting until the committee has signed off on all plans.*

The committee meets every Tuesdays at 9 a.m. at the business office. The building packets are on our website at [surfsideonline.org/forms/](http://surfsideonline.org/forms/) or you can pick them up from the business office. Applications must be received by end of day on Thursdays to make the agenda for the following Tuesday's meeting.

**Please notify the business office if you want to attend the meeting in person.**

**If you are building on a vacant lot without an address, please post a sign so the committee knows which lot will be developed.**



**Two (2) sets of plans must be submitted to the committee.** Once approved, you will get a copy of the approved plan. Take it to the county for their approval as needed. Surfside will retain one set of approved plans to keep on file.
