Hunting in Surfside

Director Phil Anderson has asked me to respond to your letter about deer hunting in Surfside, Washington. In short, hunting is legal in Pacific County, including Surfside, but the area west of Sand Ridge Road is a firearm-restricted area. Please allow me to explain:

The Washington State Legislature decided long ago that only the Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife (WDFW) has the authority to regulate the time, place, and manner of hunting and fishing in Washington. This authority is found in the Revised Code of Washington (RCW) 77.12.047. For firearms in general, the State of Washington is the sole regulatory entity; see RCW 9.41.290. What this means is that the State controls who can own, carry, and use firearms, and WDFW controls where, when, and how firearms can be used for hunting. Divisions of local government, which include cities, counties, towns, and other municipalities, can restrict the discharge of firearms within their boundaries, but only if there is a reasonable likelihood that humans, domestic animals, or property will be jeopardized. See RCW 9.41.300. Neither Pacific County nor the city of Ocean Park restrict the discharge of firearms. Homeowner's associations like Surfside cannot legally restrict the discharge of firearms or prohibit hunting on association property.

The Long Beach Peninsula, which is where Surfside is located, composes Game Management Unit (GMU) 684 for deer hunting. However, WDFW has designated the pmi of GMU #684 that is west of Sand Ridge Road as a firearm-restricted area, because WDFW recognizes the danger in people discharging modern firearms there. "Modern firearms" means centerfire and rimfire rifles. In firearm-restricted areas, hunters are only allowed to hunt with bows and arrows, crossbows, muzzleloaders, revolver-type handguns meeting equipment restrictions, or legal shotguns firing slugs or buckshot. These types of weapons are safer to hunt with in heavily populated areas and on islands, peninsulas, and the like.

It is important to note that although hunting is allowed in GMU 684, no one is permitted anywhere in Washington State to recklessly engage in conduct that creates a substantial risk of death or serious physical injury to another person. So, if a person discharges a firearm or any type of weapon in a manner that no reasonable person would and that truly endangers the safety of others, that person is committing reckless endangerment. Reckless endangerment is a crime under RCW 9A.36.050. If you see a person who you think is committing this crime, you should immediately contact your local sheriff's department or local WDFW police officer to report the activity.

This letter was confirmed by Dan Chadwick, Fish and Wildlife Police, Captain Region 6, Montesano, Washington on October 18, 2023. The laws have not changed since 2012.

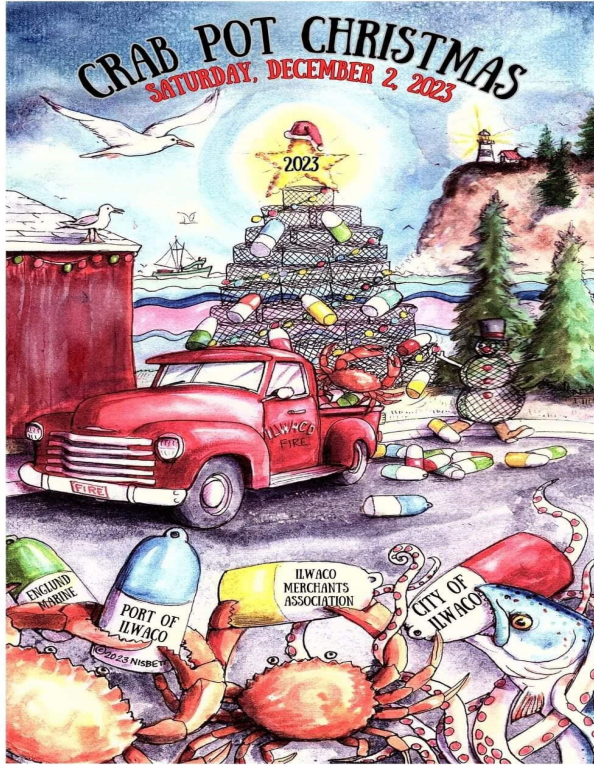

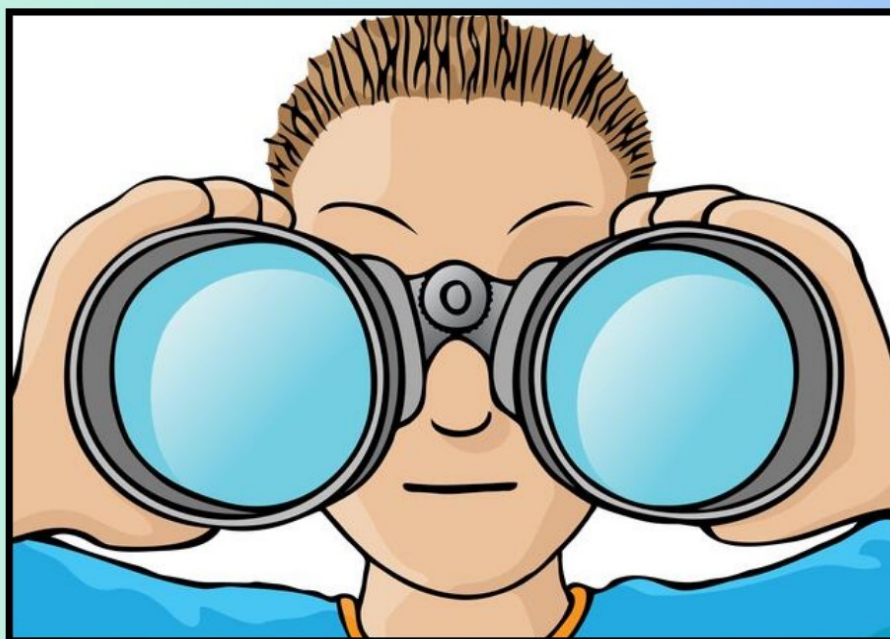

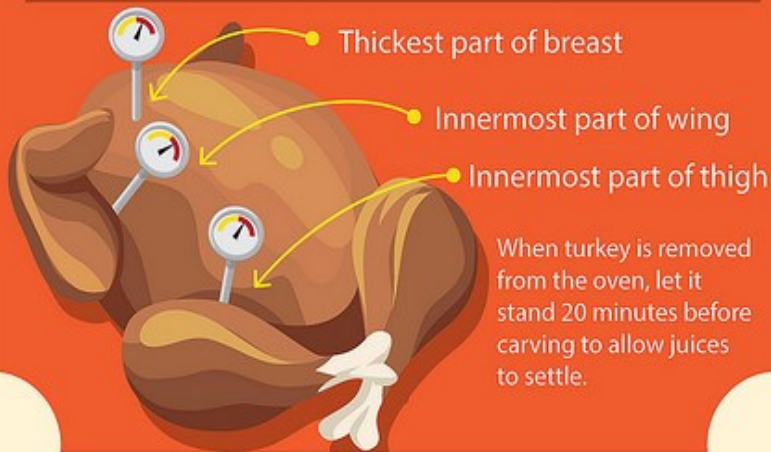
COOK



Your bird is not safe until it reaches 165 °F — you cannot tell by the color.

Remember to ensure any stuffing cooked with the bird reaches 165 °F, too!

Use three places to check the temperature.



Thickest part of breast

Innermost part of wing

Innermost part of thigh

When turkey is removed from the oven, let it stand 20 minutes before carving to allow juices to settle.



CHILL

Take your time around the dinner table, but refrigerate leftovers within 2 hours!



Safe in fridge
3-4 days

Safe frozen,
but use within
2-6 months for
best quality.



Last day Thanksgiving leftovers are safe from the fridge.



Leftover turkey should be cut into smaller pieces, and store items separately in smaller containers.



Be sure to pack leftovers in a cooler if traveling.



Reheat thoroughly to a temperature of 165 °F.

Remember, bacteria that cause foodborne illnesses can't be smelled or tasted!

DANGER: Exploding Turkey!



Deep-frying the holiday turkey is a popular method across the United States, largely due to the short cooking time involved (about 3 minutes per pound, versus several hours of roasting in the oven). However, care must be taken to avoid injury or fire. Hot oil turkey fryers are so risky, in fact, Underwriters Laboratories refuses to certify them with the "UL approved" mark.

GET A GRIP

Wear oven mitts or use pot holders. Don't try to move the fryer because the handles will get dangerously hot.

COVER BARE SKIN while adding or removing food.

PAT THAT BIRD DRY!

Turkey must be fully thawed and dry. Water or ice hitting the oil will splash, causing fire or explosion. Also, deep fry only smaller turkeys (up to 12 lbs).

PREVENT OIL SPILLS

Do not overfill with oil. Keep the temperature at 350°F (175°C). Check the thermometer frequently. Do not let the oil get too hot or it could catch fire.



Thanksgiving FIRE SAFETY TIPS



EXTINGUISHING A GREASE FIRE



STEP ONE:

TURN OFF HEAT SOURCE



STEP TWO:

DO NOT USE WATER TO EXTINGUISH A GREASE FIRE



STEP THREE:

REMOVE ALL OXYGEN- USE A BAKING SHEET OR POTS & PANS TO COVER FIRE



STEP FOUR:

USE SALT OR BAKING SODA TO EXTINGUISH REMAINING FLAMES



STEP FIVE:

IF FIRE PERSISTS, USE A DRY CHEMICAL FIRE EXTINGUISHER



STEP SIX:

CALL 911 IF FIRE BECOMES UN-MANAGEABLE

REMINDER...

ALL building plans must be submitted to the Architectural Committee prior to any construction.

Pacific County will not approve permitting until the committee has signed off on all plans.

The committee meets every Tuesdays at 9 a.m. at the business office. The building packets are on our website at surfsideonline.org/forms/ or you can pick them up from the business office. Applications must be received by end of day on Thursdays to make the agenda for the following Tuesday's meeting.

Please notify the business office if you want to attend the meeting in person.

If you are building on a vacant lot without an address, please post a sign so the committee knows which lot will be developed.

Two (2) sets of plot plans must be submitted to the committee. Once approved, you will get a copy of the approved plan. Take it to the county for their approval as needed. Surfside will retain one set of approved plans to keep on file.
