Levies also provide local schools with the financial support to provide programs that our community expects to be offered to students but are not included in the state's funding for schools.

#### The 2024 Levy will be for the following:

(1)Four-year Replacement Levy for Educational Programs and Operational Expenses that are not funded by the state.

(2)Four-year Replacement Technology Capital Improvements and Upgrades that covers capital improvements, acquisitions and upgrades to technology, networking, security, and support related to telecommunications systems in the District.

#### Ballots will be sent out in late January and must be returned by February 13, 2024.

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#### Compactor

The compactor is a great amenity for the community. We have had a bit of confusion regarding what types of items you can dispose of at the compactor.

- · Maintained for the disposal of kitchen or "wet" garbage ·
- Wet garbage or refuse must be sealed in plastic moisture-proof bags ·
- Two 45- gallon bags (or equivalent)

#### What we do not accept are the following:

- Construction or remodeling refuse.
- Large household items, e.g., rugs, TVs, mattresses and box springs, appliances or other furniture. Yard debris, e.g., grass, shrub and tree trimmings ·
- Animal Carcasses are not allowed in the compactor. Disposal must be done at the landfill and the Department of Fish & Wildlife must be notified. (WAC 246-203-121)

Compactor Attendant will monitor and enforce proper placing of materials.

#### Winter RV Permit

We kindly want to remind you that winter permits are intended solely for occupancy purposes. Unfortunately, winter permits do not cover the storage of RVs on the lots.

If you are planning to visit over the winter, we offer the convenience of requesting a winter permit at any time. You are granted a generous 60-day period to utilize as per your preference. Additionally, permits can be written for a maximum of 21 days at a time, allowing a total of 60 days for your stay.

To accommodate your needs, we are happy to arrange for permit pick-up, even if you are arriving after hours. Alternatively, we can also email the permits to you in advance, ensuring you have them prior to your visit.

#### **Detour Directions**



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## ARCHITECTURAL COMMITTEE

Plan on installing a fence, a shed, a gazebo or building a garage or a house?

REMINDER...

ALL building plans must be submitted to the Architectural Committee <u>prior</u> to any construction.

Pacific County will not approve permitting until the committee has signed off on all plans.

The committee meets every Tuesdays at 9 a.m. at the business office. The building packets are on our website at <a href="surfsideonline.org/forms/">surfsideonline.org/forms/</a> or you can pick them up from the business office. Applications must be received by end of day on Thursdays to make the agenda for the following Tuesday's meeting.

Please notify the business office if you want to attend the meeting in person.

If you are building on a vacant lot without an address, please post a sign so the committee knows which lot will be developed.

Two (2) sets of plot plans must be submitted to the committee. Once approved, you will get a copy of the approved plan. Take it to the county for their approval as needed. Surfside will retain one set of approved plans to keep on file.
