Land Buildings and Waterways Seabreeze Lake Update

Surfside is waiting on a response from the Department of Ecology following the fish die-off that occurred in early October. Surfside independently sent water samples to the Pacific Agricultural Laboratory (PAL).

The PAL certificate of analysis results showed no detectable pesticide residue. Internal water testing results continue to show improvement, and homeowners are reporting that the lake looks better than it has in years.

Surfside Water Planning Committee Meeting Minutes: October 9, 2025, 10:30 a.m.

- September Minutes Review
- 2) SCADA Presentation: John Beaudry. Committee reviewed proposed presentation for the Surfside Board. John asked to add Cyber security to list of SCADA benefits which are improved and modernized operations, assets (equipment) protection, reduce labor and improve report efficiency. Recommended to simplify presentation for non-technical HOA board members and audience.
 - Rick Dyer moved that the Water System Planning Committee approve recommendation for a SCADA system and modification of the 10-Year Plan. Seconded by Paul Couch and motion approved unanimously.
- 3) ATEC Media Replacement: Media has been replaced successfully. New media is requiring multiple back washings before use. Replaced ATEC media has been tested with results potentially listing the old media as a regulated/hazardous waste from elevated metals. This would be costly and require entanglement with the EPA. Tom Newman to contact Dana of ATEC 559 270-5262 and Dawn of BAI 360 941-3721. Follow up is to check results and to challenge the WT01 designation of old media was as "Extremely Hazardous Waste."

Election Committee—Update Floor Motions

STATUS OF FLOOR MOTIONS FROM 2025 ANNUAL MEETING

At the annual meeting on July 12, 2025, five motions were made and seconded by Surfside members. Following Election Procedure #101, Section 14, floor motions provide an opportunity for member concerns to be addressed by the Board and are a formal proposal to direct the Board to take certain action. In July, the five motions were submitted for legal review by Surfside counsel, and the Board is prepared to move forward with the process.

The five motions were:

- 1. Increasing Tree Height Limits from Restrictive Areas with 16/20 Feet Tree Height Limits to 24 Feet, While No Change to Areas with Tree Heights Above 24 Feet
- 2. Protecting Our Most Vulnerable Children and Seniors: Grant No Limit Tree Height Variances for the Health of Our Most Vulnerable Residents
- 3. Develop a Surfside Grow Tree Canopy Management Plan to Grow and Protect Trees for Environmental Pollution and Storm Protection Around Critical Areas in Surfside
- 4. Motion to Adopt Electronic Voting By the 2026 Board Election
- 5. Motion to Adopt Election Buddy as an Interim Emergency Broadcast Solution to Protect Residents and Save Lives Until a Long-term Emergency Solution is Adopted

Motions to be Presented for Member Vote

Motions 4 and 5 will be presented to the membership for a vote to provide input to the Board. Floor motions direct the Board to take the requested action under advisement.

Improper Motions

Motions 1,2, and 3 are deemed inconsistent with the general plan of the Surfside HOA development and therefore are improper motions.

Next Steps

A ballot on Floor Motions 4 and 5 will be prepared for membership voting. "FOR" and "AGAINST" Statements that were submitted at the annual meeting for these two floor motions will be posted on the Surfside webpage under the 2025 Election tab. Finally, results of the membership voting will be taken under advisement by the Board.

We anticipate a two-week timeline for preparing and mailing out the ballots on the two floor motions.

Winter RV Season starts November 1st

- October 31st marks the end of the summer RV season. Unless your lot is exempt per the covenants, RVs must be removed by October 31st.
- In the winter, November 1st to March 14th, you can use a RV winter permit for up to 60 days.
- The winter permit is issued for up to 21 days at a time and cannot exceed
 60 days total.
- While using a winter permit you must be actively occupying the RV.
- No full-time RV residency is allowed.
- If you need a winter permit, please call or visit the office.
- If you receive a violation notice about your RV, you have 10 days to correct the violation by removing your RV from your lot.
 If not corrected within the 10-day timeline, fines will begin on the 11th day.
- Fines start at \$25 a day for the first 30 days, then go to \$75 a day beginning
 on the 31st day.



ARCHITECTURAL COMMITTEE

Plan on installing a fence, a shed, a gazebo or building a garage or a house?

REMINDER...

ALL building plans must be submitted to the Architectural Committee <u>prior</u> to any construction.

Pacific County will not approve permitting until the committee has signed off on all plans.

The committee meets every Tuesdays at 9 a.m. at the business office. The plans MUST be submitted by Friday at noon to be added to the next week's agenda. The building packets are on our website at surfsideonline.org/forms/ or you can pick them up from the business office.

Please notify the business office if you want to attend the meeting in person.

If you are building on a vacant lot without an address, please post a sign so the committee knows which lot will be developed.

Two (2) sets of plot plans must be submitted to the committee. Once approved, you will get a copy of the approved plan. Take it to the county for their approval as needed. Surfside will retain one set of approved plans to keep on file.

For more detailed information on the Architectural Committee duties and guidelines go to our website <u>surfsideonline.org</u>, select the Other tab, then Governing Documents. Download the Operations Manual and the Surfside Restrictive Covenants or call the business office 360-665-4171 with questions.
